- Complete past papers to best of your ability and make notes from mark scheme for questions you are unsure of

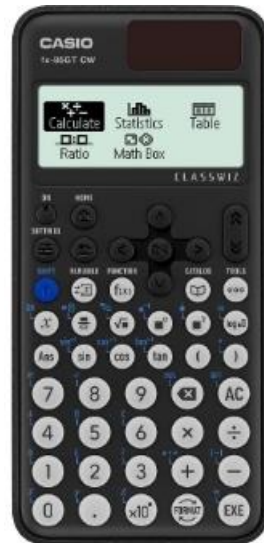
## Paper 1:
